

The October 3, 2018 meeting of the Heidelberg Township Board of Supervisors was held at the municipal building and called to order by Chairman Tim Hansen at 7:00 PM.

Tim Hansen, Larry Sterner, Matt Bollinger, Steve McKonly, John Klinedinst and Norma Markle were present.

Others present were Lonnie Lovett, Abe Aumen, Terry Frock, Celie Johns, Pat Parrish, Kendra Kauffman, Sharon Bangert, Bonnie Hasting, Bill Gromen, Dave Wickham, Clair Altland, Bill Hilbert, Linda Carter, Lola Winterstine, Tim Race, Doug Brodhecker, Paul King, Lori & Gabrielle Casteller, Allen Myers, Harry Rinedollar, Chief Bean, Amy Taylor and Scott Rabenstine.

Minutes of the September meeting were approved as presented.

Chief Bean reviewed the Police Report. He also presented a sample Fire Works Ordinance to consider. Residents in the audience voiced their opinion and experience with fire works that are going off in the Marburg/Hoff Road area. On Monday there were 22 blasts. The police have been there several times but each time are told they are shooting off legal fireworks. The residents feel this is a public safety issue, houses have been hit with stray bullets, the ground shakes and car alarms have been set off due to these blasts. Is it possible that there are illegal fireworks being set off? It was suggested that the State Representative be contacted and asked that the new fireworks law that was adopted for Pennsylvania last year be repealed. After a lengthy discussion the Board stated they will look into adopting an ordinance that fireworks can only be set off on certain holidays and limited hours. Steve McKonly will prepare an ordinance for review.

Scott Rabenstine reviewed the September Fire Report. The Department responded to 16 calls for the month. Truck-or-Treat will be held on Sunday October 28th at the Fire Hall. The Township gave a donation towards the event.

Paul King, a resident of Cannery Road, stated that the tar and chipping done on this road is causing lot of dust and there are lots of loose stones remaining along the edge of the road. Feels this is a health hazard and other materials could be used. Mr. King also questioned why Cannery Court is not maintained and he was told that this road was never adopted by the township and is a private road. The "storm drain tax" was discussed and is issued under the federal government and would be run by an authority, it was suggested they speak to the York County Commissioners.

Harry Reindollar stated he has some water issues on his property which are coming from the neighbors spouting.

Clair Altland asked about the progress with the water company. He was told a sales agreement being drafted and Bowersox would need to sign. Clair stated that the lease is due and didn't know if to pay it, he was told to pay it and it would be prorated at settlement.

Norma Markle read the September Planning Commission report.

Norma Markle read the Zoning Officers report, there was \$677.00 revenue for the month.

John Klinedinst reviewed the Engineers Report. He stated that the PIB loan is being processed for the bridge upgrade on Gitts Run Road. The signage on Gitts Run Road needs to be updated. Two well samples need to be redone for the ACT 537 Plan.

Matt Bollinger made a motion to sign and waive the review of the Charles and Patsy Hartmen Plan along Pigeon Hill Road, in Jackson Township. Less than a quarter of an acre is in Heidelberg Township, Larry Sterner seconded and Tim Hansen concurred.

Steve McKonly stated that the Public Hearing on the proposed zoning changes will be held on Wednesday November 14, 2018 at 6:30 PM.

A request from Providence Church concerning taxes from clean and green be waived. The Board tabled this request.

The York County Convention will be held November 15, 2018.

The pipe at the park entrance is filled with debris and needs to be cleaned.

A Budget Workshop will be held Wednesday October 24, 2018 at 7:00 PM.

Donations to various organizations will increase the donation to the Glatfelter Memorial Library and VNA to \$3,750.00, the rest will remain the same.

Millage rate will increase to 2.25 mills, with the Fire Company receiving .25 mills.

The Road Budget will be \$280,000.00, which includes approximately \$148,000.00 of liquid fuels monies.

The Recreation budget will be \$14,500.00.

The Police Budget will remain at the current rate of \$376,037.76.

Pay rates will increase by 3%.

The total of the 2019 Budget will be \$1,200,000.00, which is the same as 2018.
