A correction to the March 1, 2006 meeting minutes concerning the February 10, 2006 Special Meeting should read "updated" instead of correction concerning the tax millage rate. Minutes were then approved as distributed.

Sergent Dixon read the February Police Report. The department responded to 54 calls within the township. Sgt. Dixon also reported that in April and May the department can perform truck inspections at a location within the Township.

York Building Products Co. for ID-2 Wearing & ID-2A Wearing Course, @ plant & delivered. Hammaker East, LTD for E-3 and/or #-3M Emulsion. Tim Hansen seconded and Harry Rodgers concurred. There were no bids received for gas or diesel fuel.

Larry Sterner made a motion to adopt <u>RESOLUTION 06-05</u> to add the Marvin & Elizabeth Knight farm to the Agricultural Security Area for the Township. Tim Hansen seconded and Harry Rodgers concurred.

Norma Markle read the Planning Commission report.

Scott Rabenstine read the Fire Report. The Department responded to 49 calls for the month. Scott also stated that there is a County wide Burn Ban in effect.

Norma Markle read the Zoning Officers report. There was \$1,681.00 revenue for the month.

John Leen reviewed his Engineer's Report. Items discussed were the Ruhlman subdivision, one retention pond is working and one needs to be revised. Larry Sterner made a motion to adopt <u>RESOLUTION 06-06</u> to reduce the security bond for B & D Development Company, Inc. Tim Hansen seconded and Harry Rodgers concurred. A letter was sent to Link Associates - Gitts Run Mini Storage concerning the retention pond. The Rec Park E & S Plan will be resubmitted to York County Conservation District. Larry Sterner made a motion to adopt <u>RESOLUTION 06-07</u> to change the construction bond to a maintenance bond for the Weaver's septic plan on Smith Station Road. Tim Hansen seconded and Harry Rodgers concurred.

Steve McKonly reported he received a letter concerning the buyout of the police building and discussed which way the Board wanted to go on this. After discussing this it was felt that this is not an issue at this time, or until it is decided what North Codorus Township is doing.


