

YORK COUNTY RAIL TRAIL AUTHORITY INVESTING OVER \$2 MILLION FUNDED BY NATIONAL, STATE, AND COUNTY SOURCES



Oil Creek Restoration Due to the cost of this project, construction has been divided into several phases. This spring, Site A Phase 1 construction will begin between Gitts Run Road and Jacobs Mill Road, Heidelberg Township, to restore approximately 1,300 linear feet of stream and create approximately 7.5 acres of new wetlands. Through a public bidding process, Aquatic Resource Restoration of York, PA, was selected to perform this phase of creek restoration. Funding from the National Fish and Wildlife Fund, PA Department of Environmental Protection, Governor's Office of Budget, and York County Conservation District combine to meet the expected cost of over \$1.2 million.

Trail Construction Later this spring, construction of 1.07 miles of trail from Gitts Run Road to the dormant rail line is scheduled to begin. State funding from the PA Department of Conservation & Natural Resources and the Governor's Office of Budget and local funding from York County Marcellus Shale Fund provide the estimated cost of \$824,000.

2025 and Beyond As additional funds are received Oil Creek restoration and expansion of the Hanover Trolley Trail in Heidelberg Township will continue into 2025. Work will include trail building to Jacobs Mill Road and creek restoration for Site A Phase 2.


