

The July 3, 2002 meeting of the Heidelberg Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:30 PM at the Heidelberg Township Municipal Building, by Chairman Harry Rodgers.

Harry Rodgers, Paul Hilbert, Larry Sterner, Steve McKonly, Dale Myers and Norma Markle were present.

Others present were Bruce Jones, Matt Bollinger, Merle Riley, Jeff Lauchman, Randy Shearer, James, George & Jocelyn Johns, Ed Morin, Sterling Feeser, Bonnie Hasting, Bob Finke, Brian Stambaugh, Pat Carey, Tim Hansen, Tom Shultz, John & Virginia Hansen, Jim Boyer and Don Dyke.

Minutes of the June meeting were approved as distributed.

Bruce Jones reported the Michael's feed was a success, the DCNR grant looks positive. The field will be used on Sunday's for softball games.

Jim Boyer and Don Dyke from Trout Unlimited would like the Board to adopt a Resolution of support for their company to apply for grant monies concerning areas along waterways within the Township for fishing purposes. They will be unable to get this grant without a resolution. Harry stated he felt that this is between the landowners and the Township. Mr. Boyer stated that there will be no obligation if signed and neighboring Townships had signed. Tim Hansen a landowner which would be effected stated that the landownere were never contacted and the land is all privately owned. The Board was in favor of Trout Unlimited working with the landowners and not the Township.

James Johns stated that his son is ready to build on Hoff Road but is not able to obtain a State Highway Permit without the Stambaugh's signing a form. Mr. Johns feels they have a deeded right-of-way. Steve McKonly stated that he feels everything is in order and a permit should be issued. Brian Stambaugh stated he has spoken to 5 adjoining land owners and they are not in favor of this. He stated this lot was not sold as a building lot, just a woodlot. Steve stated this was a preexisting lot sold before zoning was enacted in the Township. After a lengthy discussion Harry Rodgers informed Norma Markle to issue the permit to Mr. Johns.

Tom Shultz, representing B & D - Dirk Wildasin, reported the modules sent to DEP were rejected because it stated that public sewer was not available along Gitts Run Road. The sewer on this road is with Penn Township and Heidelberg Township does not want to go into the sewer business. Larry Sterner made a motion to adopt Resolution 02-06 to resubmit this module to DEP stating sewer is not feasible for this area. Paul Hilbert seconded, Harry Rodgers concurred.

A letter from Worley Surveying was read requesting a 90 day extension for the James Martin subdivision. This Board granted this

extenstion.

Randy Shearer and David Haines from Michael's Casual Dining stated they are waiting on Penn DOT approval for this proposed plan which was approved by the Planning Commission. Paul Hilbert made a motion to approve this plan pending issuance of State Highway Permit. Larry Sterner seconded, Harry Rodgers concurred.

Norma Markle read the Planning Commission report.

Ed Morin read the Fire Report. There were 15 calls for the month.

Dale Myers read his "last" police report. The Department traveled 3,160 miles and had 497 hours of service for the month. The Department disbanded June 30, 2002 and Chief Myers retired June 30, 2002. Dale gave alot of the equipment to the Police Museum in York. Harry thanked Dale for his years of service to the Township.

Matt Bollinger read the EMA Report. He thanked the road crew for their assistance during a thunder storm. Matt will be attending a County seminar next week.

Norma Markle read the Zoning Officers report. There was \$ 1,915.00 revenue for the month.

Steve McKonly reviewed the police pension plan and feels everything was in order.

Larry Sterner stated the new truck was picked up and is now being lettered and the radios will be installed.

Paul Hilbert stated the locks within the Township building will be changed next week.

Harry Rodgers stated that the Spring Grove Area Community Center would like to hold their August 13, 2002 meeting at this building. This was approved by the Board.

Norma Markle received a letter from the York County Rail Trail Authority wanting the Township to support them for a possible rail trail area. The Board did not support this.

A letter was received from W. Manheim Twp. for Fire Police assistance at the Parkville carnival. This was approved by the Board.

A letter was received from Jefferson Borough for Fire Police assistance at the Jefferson Carnival. (7/8 - 7/13) This was approved by the Board.

Norma Markle read the Treasures Report.
