The May 3, 2006 meeting of the Heidelberg Township Board of Supervisors was held at the municipal building and called to order at 7:30 PM by Chairman Harry Rodgers.

Harry Rodgers, Larry Sterner, Tim Hansen, Steve McKonly, John Leen and Norma Markle were present.

Others present were Lucas Parks, Scott Rabenstine, Kevin Amoss, Dwight Yoder, Melissa Johes, Tom Fort, Terry Frock, Ron Frock, Tim & Renee Hippensteel, Rand Feder, Wayne Winemiller, Roland Vrakin, Darlene Rabenstine, Tony Eline, Bruce Jones and Ted & Deona Schmittel.

Minutes of the April meeting were approved as distributed.

Dwight Yoder, Atty. representing Community Services Group, along with Melissa Jones from CSG, asked the Supervisors to grant a "reasonable accommodation", under the Fair Housing Act, to permit 8 individuals with disabilities to live together in a single famile dwelling located at 1862 Smith Station Road. SCG is an organization that provides community-based mental health services and provides support to individuals with disabilities in residential settings. Mr. Yoder stated that this property lies on 2+ acres of land, the house has 3,500 sq. ft. of living area, which includes 6 bedrooms. There are no current sewer problems and there is an adaquate parking area. The residents would live together as a family unity and maintain a common household and share common household routines and chores. These residents have a disability defined under the FHA which impairs many major life activities. The house will be staffed on a 24 hour basis. Mr. Yoder feels the Township's zoning ordinance along with the decision of the Zoning Hearing Board violates the FHA. Rand Feter, Atty. representing several residents of the Smith Station Road area stated he feel the ZHB made the right decision. What CSG is asking for is a stretch of the zoning laws, all conclusion, no facts. Harry Rodgers statd that the Board is not able to respond to Mr. Yoder's request at this time, because the Supervisors have not had enough time to review all the information. Mr. Yoder stated they are dealing with deadlines and desire a decision as soon as possible. Harry said the next Supervisors meeting will be June 7, 2006 and there would be no decision before that time.

Bruce Jones stated that baseball and lacross fields are in use and things are moving forward.

Tim Hansen made a motion to adopt <u>RESOLUTION 06-09</u> to fund the Southwestern Regional Police at the 2005 budget level for the last 9 months of 2006. Larry Sterner seconded and Harry Rodgers concurred.

Scott Rabenstine stated that he is concerned with the CSG housing because the house would be locked-down and that is a big concern for the Fire Company. Also, Scott stated that the Fire Company has a great working relationship with the Southwestern Regional Police and would hate to see the department desolve.

A request was received from Spring Grove Borough requisting the assistance of our Fire Police for the Spring Grove Area Community Center's September Fest, Saturday September 23, 2006. Tim Hasen made a motion to allow this service, Larry Sterner seconded and Harry Rodgers concurred.

Norma Markle read the Treasures Report.
