Tim Hansen, Larry Sterner, Matt Bollinger, Steve McKonly, John Leen, Jay Little and Norma Markle were present.

Others present were Bill Pero, Michael Zittle, Scott Rabenstine, Joni Moser and Officer Dickmeyer.

Minutes of the August meeting were approved as distributed.

Bill Pero of the Spring Grove Area Ambulance Club presented an overview of their services. Well Span is no longer providing the service and this is causing a rise in calls for them. A membership drive has been mailed to the community. The Club will need to provide Workman's Comp and liability insurance to those working. Bill will forward the "Contract for Cooperative Partnership" to Steve McKonly for his review and comments.

Officer Dickmeyer presented the July Police Report. The Department responded to 71 calls within the Township.

Michael Zittle stated he is concerned about the appearance of the roads and intersections along Township roads. Scott Rabenstine read the August Fire Report. The department responded to 12 calls for the month.
